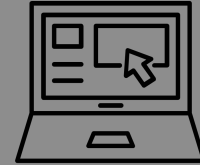

Students are required to earn two online learning credits to graduate from secondary school, beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year. The graduation requirement is intended to support students in developing literacy and critical thinking skills and learning in a fully online environment, as well as developing digital literacy and other important transferable skills that will help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives. Please submit this form ONLY if you are choosing to opt out of the online learning requirement.

Online learning refers to the study of a course by a student who is physically present with one another or with their teacher in a classroom setting. This form is for students who are requesting more information about online learning credits in Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. Please contact your child's teacher, Guidance Counsellor or Administrator if you have additional questions.

There is no need to notify the online learning credit team if you are not requesting to opt out of the online learning requirement. If you are requesting to opt out of the online learning requirement, please notify the online learning credit team by the deadline of 2024-03-31.

In order to be eligible for the online learning requirement, students must be enrolled in the graduation program and related to the student's school. Parents/guardians may choose to opt out their child from the mandatory online courses required for graduation. Students 18 years of age or older or students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control can also opt out of the graduation requirement. Students who are parents/guardians can opt back in to the online learning requirement at any time. Please contact your child's teacher for more information. Upon receipt, this form will be reviewed by the online learning credit team.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - BE AWARE OF...34 CREDIT CAP

Ontario secondary students will be funded for a **maximum of 34 credits**

- ALL credits count whether taken at WCI or elsewhere (i.e. elearn, summer school, repeated courses, etc.)
- Exceptions:
  - ESL students - speak to your guidance counsellor to learn more
  - Student with an active IEP



## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS - BE AWARE OF...

- **Repeated Courses** - only count as 1 credit BUT do count toward your 34 credit cap
- **Full Disclosure Date** - Grade 11 or 12 courses must be dropped:
  - 5 days after receiving mid-term Report Cards or the courses will **remain on a student's transcript.**
- **SHSM** - If not completing, notify Guidance by December 1st  
*\*Affects your graduation and you will not earn your diploma!\**



- #2: “SAFE BET”
- #3: “LOCAL”
- Most students apply to 3-6 programs/schools



# MARK REPORTING TIMELINES

- Marks submitted to colleges & universities:
  - **1st semester MIDTERM grades**
  - **1st semester FINAL grades**
  - **2nd semester MIDTERM grades**
  - All grade 11 & 12 grades for courses previously taken
  - All grade 11 & 12 courses you plan to take this year
- Colleges & universities use these marks to determine if offer of admission in April/May
- If you receive an offer, they are **ALWAYS conditional offers** (i.e. maintain an 80% average)
- WCI submits **2nd semester FINAL grades in July** to ensure that you maintained the offer requirements
- If conditions NOT met, **offer is revoked**

# REPEATED COURSES AND COURSES OUTSIDE OF REGULAR DAY SCHOOL

---

## Repeated Courses

- It is **YOUR responsibility** to understand the impact of repeating a course
  - Many schools take the higher of the two grades; others take the most recent grade and others will penalize your application for a repeated course

## Courses Taken Outside of Regular Day School

- Some schools will penalize your application, others permit elearning courses (with an explanation), some penalize private school courses while others accept all Ontario credits
