




# Territorial Acknowledgement



# COMPULSORY CREDITS

There are **FIVE (5)** Grade 9 **COMPULSORY CREDITS**:

- **English:** ENL1WI
- **Math:** MTH1WI or **MTH1WZ (ESL)**
- **Science:** SNC1WI or **SNC1WZ (ESL)**
- **Geography:** CGC1WI or **CGC1WZ (ESL)** or **CGC1WF (Extended French)**
- **French:** FSF1DI (Core) or **FEF1DF (Extended French)**
- **Possibly Technology:** Take in Grade 9 (TAS10I) or in Grade 10 (various options)

# HOW DO WE ENTER A MAGNET PROGRAM?

- Boundaries apply
- If attending on a Magnet from an eligible out of boundary school, transportation may be provided
- No additional fees are charged
- Students must remain in magnet for **2 full years**
