

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- Be aware of:
 - Full-Time Student expectation you take 4 COURSES (*NO SPARES)
 - Repeated Courses be careful of impact of repeated courses on university applications (i.e. UW Engineering)
 - 34 Credit Cap As an ESL student, you are NOT limited to 34 courses
 - Prerequisite Courses Refer to the PURPLE Course Calendar to know what the prerequisite courses are (i.e. Need to take MCR3UI before MHF4UI)

COURSE CODES ENSURE YOU HAVE THE PREREQUISITES!

You need to have six (6) grade 12 "U" or "M" (ie. ENG4UI or SNC4MI) level courses to apply to a university in ONTARIO



Your **FOURTH** English course needs to be **ENG4UI** (*Always required for Ontario university programs) OR

ENG4CI (required for Ontario college programs)





What are the implications of **taking courses outside of regular day school**?

"Our goal is to admit students who have the right preparation to be successful in a rigorous full-time program, not simply those with the best grades. Taking all courses through your regular day school provides the best preparation for success in university studies.

If you have taken, or are taking, courses outside of regular day school, your overall admission score may be adjusted. You will be asked to explain why a course has been taken outside your regular course load on the Admission Information Form."

What are the implications of Repeated courses?

"Due to a high level of competition, we strive to make our admission process as fair as possible. Repeating courses in order to improve your average provides an unfair advantage, as compared to students who achieve high marks in their first attempts. For this reason, repeating courses may result in a reduction of your calculated admission average by 5%, which may also impact your eligibility for scholarships.

On the <u>Admission Information Form</u>, we will ask for an explanation for any repeated Grade 12 subjects. Exceptional circumstances will be reviewed for an exemption from the penalty."



- Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), or equivalent, or 19 years of age or older with mature student status (See Mature Student definition for details.)
- Grade 12 compulsory English, C or U, or equivalent, OR Conestoga College Preparatory Communications (COMM1270)
- Grade 11 Mathematics, C, M (U/C), or U, or equivalent, OR Conestoga College Preparatory Mathematics (MATH1375)
- For more information on preparatory programs, visit <u>Academic</u> Upgrading

Admission Procedures

- An academic strength is calculated by averaging the submitted marks of required subjects. If more than one mark is received for a required subject, the highest mark will be used in the calculation.
- Ten (10) additional marks are added to each Advanced level, OAC, U, U/C, and post-secondary course used in the calculation of academic strength.
- A sound mathematical and English background is important for success in this program and is considered during the admission selection process. Minimum cutoffs apply.

 Strong mathematical skills and familiarity with computers is recommended.


